

On behalf of the Cullman County Commission, I am submitting the enclosed TIGER application for Road Rehabilitation Funds. These funds will be used to rehabilitate approximately forty miles of farm-to-market roads that were damaged by the tornado outbreak of April 27, 2011 and the subsequent clean-up efforts, which will greatly benefit and impact Cullman County and the region, including an overwhelming number of low and moderate income residents. The total project cost is \$11,833,118 and the County has committed \$2,366,624 (20%) to complete the project.


Dear Secretary Foxx:

I write with regard to Cullman County Alabama's application to the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) for a Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant.

I have been informed that Cullman County is seeking TIGER funding to repair and resurface approximately 40 miles of farm to market roads that were destroyed during the April 27, 2011, tornados. Cullman County is currently the largest broiler and cattle producing county in the State of Alabama, which along with the county's agricultural, forestry, and related industries, constitutes over forty percent of the county's total workforce. Together, these industries have a \$2.4 billion economic impact and results in over fifty percent of Cullman County's total economic activity. It is my hope that, if selected as a grantee, Cullman County's restoration of the deteriorated farm to market roads will assist boost region's overall economic efforts.
